Interdisciplinary and International

At University of Applied Sciences Potsdam, students enrol at the Faculty of Educational and Social Sciences. The modules offered are interdisciplinary, including sociology, political science, law, and others. The first semester is dedicated to three introductory modules. They are the basis for the second semester in which students will gain insight in specific children's rights topics. The third semester has a practical focus in which students engage in a children's rights project, work as interns or write a research proposal as well as their final M.A. thesis. Over the past 10 years, the number of international students in the programme has increased to about 40-50% and the variety of disciplinary backgrounds is immense, which enriches the classroom dynamics and enables a multinational and multidisciplinary learning environment.

Target groups

The MACR is directed to everybody interested in working in the field of children's rights and in particular to:

- Graduates of social sciences, law, education, social work and other disciplines with first professional experiences.
- Professionals in governmental and non-governmental institutions and organizations in the field of youth work, education, social services, health and law with a first academic degree (BA, equivalent or higher).

Degree of successful graduation

Successful completion of modules at partner universities is recognized as part of the program at University of applied sciences Potsdam through standardized transcripts of records. The degree awarded to graduates of University of Applied Sciences is a Master of Arts (M.A.)

Reasons for studying the MACR

Children must be respected as social subjects with own views, ideas and feelings. They should have the possibility to play an active and responsible role in the design of their living surroundings. Therefore it is necessary to protect their rights and to ensure their full implementation. Studying the M.A. Childhood Studies and Children's Rights will enable you to contribute to making this a reality.

Tuition fees and application deadline

The tuition fees are calculated cost covering, i.e. non- profit making. At University of Applied Sciences Potsdam, tuition fees are currently 5.965€ for the entire programme exclusing administrative fees of about 280€ per semester (incl. a ticket for public transportation in Berlin and Brandenburg).

The annual application deadline is May 15.

Development of the MACR and networking

The MACR was developed in cooperation with the European Network of Masters in Children's Rights (ENMCR), to be converted into the Children's Rights European Academic Network (CREAN), a network of higher education institutions from across Europe offering study programmes children's rights and/or modules on childhood studies and children's rights in other extant study programmes.

The network has contacts with various leading human and children's rights organizations in most European countries and cooperates with different public agencies, providing them with reliable information, and welcoming their staff for guest lectures. Partner universities and exchange



The MACR was developed by seven European universities from 2004–2007 and has entered into cooperation with several other universities.
