**18th Anniversary UN Convention on the Rights
of the Child**
**Indications for Europe and the foreseen EU Strategy on the

On November 20, 2007 the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child will turn 18 years old. How to reach Voßstrasse 22 at Potsdamer Platz

By Public Transportation:

from Berlin Hauptbahnhof with S 5 (Straußberg Nord), S 7 (Ahrensfelde), S 9 (Flughafen Schönefeld) or S 75 (Wartenberg) to Bahnhof Friedrichstraße. From there with S 1 (Wannsee), S 2 (Blankenfelde) oder S 25 (Teltow Stadt) bis Potsdamer Platz.

from Bahnhof Zoologischer Garten with Bus 200 or U 2 (Pankow) to Potsdamer Platz.

from Bahnhof Friedrichstraße with S 1 (Wannsee), S 2 (Blankenfelde) or S 25 (Teltow Stadt) to Potsdamer Platz.

from Bahnhof Alexanderplatz with Bus 200 or U 2 (Ruhleben) to Potsdamer Platz.

from Tegel with Bus TXL to Unter den Linden. From there with Bus 200 or S 1 (Wannsee), S 2 (Blankenfelde) or S 25 (Teltow Stadt) to Potsdamer Platz.

from Schönefeld with S 9 (Spandau) to Friedrichstraße. From there with S 1 (Wannsee), S 2 (Blankenfelde) or S 25 (Teltow Stadt) to Potsdamer Platz.

From FU Berlin with U3 (Nolendorfplatz) to Nolendorfplatz. From there with U2 (Pankow) to Potsdamer Platz.

Information regarding tickets for the Berlin transportation:

You can buy tickets for the S-Bahn or U-Bahn directly at the station. There are machines at every S-Bahn and U-Bahn station. A ticket for a single trip (Einzelfahrausweis AB) costs 2,10€ in one direction (valid for 2 hours). A ticket for one day (Tageskarte AB) costs 6,10€. In case you travel by bus you must buy tickets from the bus driver. Always enter the bus from the front door.
