4. International Journal of Research in Extended Education (IJREE)

- On behalf of the Editor-in-chief Sang-Hoon Bae, the managing editor of IJREE Nayoun Kang introduces:
 - IJREE is the unique and internationally recognized refereed journal in the field of extended education: https://www.budrich-journals.de/index.php/IJREE
 - Since it was first published in 2013, it has been published twice a year June and December.
 - The issue 2/2023 is in printing by a publisher.
 - The issue 1/2024 is now being edited and typesetting.
 - The issue 2/2024 (Special issue) is now on the review.
 - IJREE can be found in a variety of international search engines: ASCI (Asian Science Citation Index), ERIC (Education Resources Information Center, ARC (Australian Research Council), Norwegian Research Database, EBSCOhost, Education Index, Google Scholar, etc.

Special Issue

- o The special issue is closely aligned with the annual conference.
- It focuses on a specific theme, bringing together cutting-edge research and insights on the topic.
- o It aims to provide a comprehensive exploration of the chosen topic.
- o Since 2018, seven special issues have been published.
- Guest Editor
 - Who proposes the special issue serves as the Guest Editor.
 - Guest editor curates and oversees the selection of articles, ensuring a comprehensive exploration of the theme.
- A special issue based on the conference 2024 about children's perspectives will be the second issue of 2025.

5. Next Activities

- Focus groups: Michelle Jutzi announced that the TASK FORCE will support members in organizing "focus groups" to enhance the research collaboration in the field of extended education:
 - What is a focus group? Researchers and practitioners in the field of Extended Education come together in focus groups that are centered around a particular aspect/field/topic of research in Extended Education. The role of a focus group is to
 - Enable a continuous exchange between researchers (and practitioners)

- Develop a common understanding of key terms and concepts in their field
- Hold regular online meetings (dates will be published on the website)
- Contribute to EE conferences (host a meetup, the day before the start of the conference, invited symposium), webinars,
- Improve collaboration between researchers, less formal

Time Frame of the focus groups

- Focus Group initiators/coordinators have to be members of the Task Force
- Exist for two years max.
- (Re-)Approved by the Task Forces Executive Committee
- No more than six focus groups exist at the same time
- No additional funding

Two examples

- Focus Group "Leadership in Extended Education" (Organizer: Michelle Jutzi): Leadership in Extended Education has many similarities with leadership in schools or other social institutions. However, there are also specific aspects of leadership - such as close collaboration with the school, status and with parents, clarifying the pedagogical concept between school and leisure - that make the leadership of an EE provision unique. However, there is little research on this topic. Furthermore, the situation of leadership training for EE differs between countries and often does not have a clear, theoretically based curriculum. This focus group brings together researchers and lecturers/practitioners from universities and other EE leadership institutions to discuss the core tasks of leaders in EE, as well as the challenges and opportunities arising from the responsible role of leading an EE. Topics such as human resource management, finance, quality management, etc. as core leadership responsibilities will be discussed in depth.
- Focus Group "Autonomy and Self-Determination in Extended Education" (Organizer: undetermined): In EE children's autonomy, self-regulation and self-determination are key and a great opportunity for interaction and relationship building between students and staff. However, many countries struggle with the challenges of an institutionalized environment of EE concerning the amount of free play or structured activities. This can often lead to conflict between staff and students. This focus group is about creating an environment that not only provides leisure activities and play, but also encourages interaction between students and staff, creating a pleasant atmosphere and empowering students to act. In the focus group we will discuss how to create good quality environment in EE, considering the structures, contexts and processes that are important for children and staff. The research in this focus group can be varied and encourages the exploration of children's views from qualitative perspectives.
